Eighteen Additions Made As Faculty Is Augmented

No less than eighteen new faces may be seen on the Canisius faculty this year as a result of "big league trades" completed this summer.

Reverend John C. Connelly, S.J., recently stationed at the Jesuit Retreat House, Glenmont, N. Y., has replaced Father Philip B. Carroll, S.J. as Director of Development. Father Carroll will take over Father Connelly's duties at the Jesuit Retreat House in Albany.

Joining the faculty of Canisius as an Assistant Professor in Philosophy is the Reverend Joseph V. Dolan, S.J. Father Dolan, who will teach Psychology, comes from Laval University, Quebec, where he completed his doctorate studies in Philosophy.

Reverend Edward F. Maloney, S.J., who recently completed his studies in Theology at St. Beuno's in North Wales, will be a member of the Department of Theology.

Taking up the post of Assistant Professor of Physics, after finishing his Tertianship in Munster, Germany, is the Reverend James J. Rud-

dick, S.J. He formerly taught on the faculty of St. Peter's College.

Added to the new lay faculty are: Anthony A. Casassa, Instructor of Modern Languages, who is currently working on his doctorate at Syracuse University; Gerald C. Fischer, Assistant Professor of Banking and Finance, completing his doctoral thesis at Columbia; and Dr. Robert Hagspiel, Instructor of Modern Languages, a native of Innsbruck, Austria, where he received his Ph.D.

Appointed as an Assistant Professor of English was Dr. Leslie C. Warren. An English teacher since 1930, Dr. Warren received his doctorate from the University of Chicago and later served on its faculty. Dr. Richard E. Stan-

ton, an Instructor at the Catholic University in Washington in the past, has been appointed Assistant Professor of Chemistry at Canisius. He earned his Ph.D. in physical chemistry at Notre Dame University. A native of Poland, Dr. Tadeusz D. Poznaniak has received his appointment as Assistant Professor of Mathematics. Dr. Poznaniak holds a Ph.D. in Education from the University of Ottawa.

Other new faculty members include Mr. Sanford S. McIntire, who attended Boston College and Boston University, Assistant Professor of Management; Dr. Pierce L. Wolf, a graduate of Geneva University, who will serve as Assistant Professor of Biology; and Mr. Gilbert C. Wright, an alumnus of Notre Dame, who has been appointed Instructor in English.

Mr. Michael D. Zeik, (M. A.—Notre Dame) is an addition to the History and Political Science Department of Canisius, while Dr. Lawrence J. Minet and Dr. Robert J. Paulis have been appointed Assistant Professors of Economics. The former is a graduate of the University of Buffalo, while the latter completed his undergraduate and graduate studies at the University of Prague.

Supplementing the lay faculty are two new ROTC officers and instructors, Major William D. Brown and Captain Robert T. Fallon. Major Brown will serve as executive officer to Lt. Col. Richard B. Engel, commanding officer of the Canisius ROTC. Captain Fallon has been appointed training officer for the Corps.
