Community Standards

- Set of guidelines that set expectations for behavior of Canisius College students.
- Disciplinary meetings are meant to be educational, not punitive.

Guidelines for Maintaining Academic Integrity

Avoid procrastination. Disorganization and poor time management can lead you to panic, poor judgment and academic dishonesty.

Protect your passwords and computer files; don't let others use your computer. Do not leave unfinished assignments in computer labs or waste baskets for others to find.

During tests do not talk or communicate with anyone in or out of the room—no cell phones or text messaging.

While it is fine to discuss strategies for writing papers, preparing for exams and presentations, please do not share your actual papers, presentations and other work with other students.

Keep copy or photocopies of notes, outlines and drafts of your papers and projects, as a record that you did, in fact, do the work on your own.





Guidelines for Maintaining Academic Integrity-2

If you need clarification on any aspect of writing, research or documentation you can get help from your instructor, the tutoring center or the library. Both the library and the tutoring center have extensive hours.

Bear in mind that Canisius College subscribes to Turnitin.com. A plagiarism detection program.

If you witness what appears to be a violation of the Code of Academic Integrity, report your concerns to your instructor or academic advisor.





Consequences of Violating the Code of Academic integrity

- In most cases, any student found to have violated the Code will be required to meet with their Associate Dean to discuss the violation, the penalty imposed by the instructor and any additional penalty or consequences as determined by the Associate Dean.
- Under some circumstances violations of the Code can lead to suspension, transcript notations and even expulsion from the College.
- Planning your time carefully and using all campus resources will ensure your academic integrity.
- Making an honest effort and failing is always preferable to failure as a consequence of violating the code.
